

Resizing digital images for competitions they must be submitted as jpeg files sized with maximum dimensions width 1400 x height 1050 pixels, and preferably as sRGB.

Resizing images in Photoshop


- 1. Always make a duplicate file and work on the new file.
- 2. Open the image
- 3. Click on the "Image" menu button, and then click "Image size" from the drop down menu.
- 4. Landscape format In the "Pixel Dimensions" box, change "width" to 1400 pixels. Now check the "height". If this exceeds 1050 pixels, change the "height" to 1050 pixels.



5. Portrait format - In the "Pixel Dimensions" box, change "height" to 1050 pixels.



6. Go to Edit – Assign Profile – and change to sRGB



7. Save image as a JPG (Use "File> Save As" to ensure you don't over-write your original).

Resizing images in Photoshop Elements

- 1. Always make a duplicate file and work on the new file

- 4. Landscape format In the "Pixel Dimensions" box, change "width" to 1400 pixels. Now check the "height". If this exceeds 1050 pixels, change the "height" to 1050 pixels
- 5. Portrait format In the "Pixel Dimensions" box, change "height" to 1050 pixels
- 6. Image convert colour profile and select convert to sRGB
- 7. Save image as a JPG (Use "File> Save As" to ensure you don't over-write your original)
